



## Corsica – Sardinia

### 1<sup>st</sup> day

#### CORSICA - CALVI

Start from Calvi, ancient little town in the NW of Corsica.

Have a good dinner in the restaurant L'Alivu, set in the picturesque hills of Calvi between the sea and the mountains



### 2<sup>nd</sup> day

#### GIROLATA

Heading south, stop at the peninsula of Girolata, a pretty village in turquoise waters.

#### BONIFACIO

Spend the night in this town lying in a beautiful fjord. All around it, white cliffs. You can eat fresh sea food and special fish by "Les Caravelles".

### 3<sup>rd</sup> day

#### SARDINIA - ARCHIPELAGO OF LA MADDALENA

One of the last paradises in Italy. It's a natural park, and you can still see dolphins and rare fish that disappeared in the rest of the Med.



#### PORTO CERVO

Famous all over the world, Porto Cervo is the right place for those who love night life. Don't miss the restaurant Il Pescatore, set in the old port, with a lovely terrace on the water. Or the Billionaire, the famous night club that hosts the restaurant Cipriani – Porto Cervo, and where you can meet stars of the sports and show-biz!

### 4<sup>th</sup> day

#### CALA DI VOLPE

This is a little bay between Porto Cervo and Porto Rotondo. It is crowded of the biggest and most important yachts. If you are a golf player, go to Pevero Golf Club, one of the most important Golf Clubs in the world.

#### PORTO ROTONDO

A romantic and lovely place where to spend quiet days and nights. Little streets and nice boutiques make this village unique. Our suggestion for an excellent dinner is the restaurant Gallura, 20 minutes far from Porto Rotondo.

### 5<sup>th</sup> day

#### GOLFO DI OROSEI

Wild and don't miss natural beauties like Cala Luna, Cala Mariolu, Cala Goloritzé or Cala Sisine. Then head for Villasimius, a little village, with wonderful beaches and transparent waters

#### CAGLIARI

The capital of Sardinia is the economic e political centre of the island. Not far from the centre of the town there's the international airport of Elmas.

### 6<sup>th</sup> day

#### NORA

Close to the famous Forte Village, there is Nora. This fantastic ancient village of Phoenician and Roman origins, is part submerged, but ashore you'll see beautiful mosaics.

#### CARLOFORTE

Typical old genoaan village, it has been founded in the second part of the 18<sup>th</sup> century by some coral catchers coming back from Tabarka, Tunisia. Genoan dialect is spoken even now

### 7<sup>th</sup> day

#### ALGHERO

The fortified town of Alghero founded in the 12<sup>th</sup> century by the genoans, but conquered in the 14<sup>th</sup> century by the Catalanian, is one of the more charming towns of the island. The restaurant Al Tuguri is very characteristic.

For the lovers of wine, don't miss a visit to the vineyard and the cellar of Sella & Mosca, the Sardinian partner of Martini Group where you can taste the best of the Sardinian wine.

#### STINTINO

Light green waters and white sand. Not to miss!
